

Field Trip Prices

Minimum of one week notice is required to receive education rates. Prices are valid for schools and camps only. If reservations are not made prior to the field trip date, full admission will be charged. All prices are subject to 7% sales tax. Tax exempt schools/camps must provide the Sales and Events Department with a copy of their Tax Exempt Certificate prior to the field trip date.

Zoo Miami Members

Valid Zoo Miami membership passes will be accepted on field trips for the admission portion of additional chaperones only. Chaperones that are valid Zoo Miami members will need to purchase all of the additional activities scheduled by the school/camp the day of the field trip, if available, and will be charged 7% sales tax for all items. Some activities have limited space and if not reserved in advance, members may not be able to participate and will not incur a charge for that activity.
